Open Meeting

Chairperson Waninger opened the meeting at 7:31 AM.

Adjustment of the Agenda

Consent Agenda (Action Item)

Commissioner Dimitruk motioned to approve the Consent Agenda. Commissioner Wallis seconded, and the motion was unanimously approved.



South Burlington Commissioner Matt Cota Introduction

- New Commissioner from South Burlington, replacing Commissioner Charlie Baker, who
 moved out of South Burlington.
- Served on South Burlington's Development Review Board for five years.
- Elected to South Burlington City Council in March and was appointed to the GMT board in Former Commissioner Baker's place.
- Runs a trade association based in Montpelier.
- GMT Commissioners and Staff introduced themselves to Commissioner Cota.

VTrans Update

Ross MacDonald absent. No update given.

General Manager Report – Updates and Opportunity for Questions on the Report (Cont. Next Page)

General Manager, Jon Moore, provided an update regarding Neighborhood Special services and union negotiations.

Commissioner Bohne was disappointed by the Proterra analysis and requested that Jon Moore expand on Maintenance and Operations' views on the buses. **Jon Moore:** Staff were trained on the buses in May, but the buses are still experiencing some reliability issues. No towing, however.

Alt. Commissioner Derenthal: Is it practice to create an annual report? If so, what is in that report? Lastly, would there be a comparison between this year and previous fiscal years? **Jon Moore**: GMT compiles annual reports to share with municipalities in their annual Town Meeting Day reports.

Commissioner Sharrow: Regarding electric buses rural areas, what are our options, as far as manufacturers? **Jon Moore:** Currently, there are no small electric vehicles (cutaway or Sprinter-type) that have undergone the Altoona testing required by the Federal Transit Administration; however, several are scheduled to undergo such testing within the approximately next 12 months. **Matt Kimball**: GMT issued an award to DATTCO, who provides GMT with petroleum-powered buses. GMT is looking at an electric Turtle Top bus that is currently undergoing Altoona testing. While there is one small electric bus currently available, it is more expensive than the petroleum-powered buses.

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General Manager Report – Updates and Opportunity for Questions on the Report (Cont.

Commissioner Kaynor: Is the Vermont Energy Investment Corporation (VEIC) taking a role in the procurement of the rural EVs, as they did with the Proterra buses? **Jon Moore**: Yes.

Commissioner Kaynor: How about with data analysis? **Matt Kimball**: Yes, though the Proterra buses will likely need to accumulate more mileage for more meaningful results. Reliability issues over the past year have also contributed to this lack of data. **Jon Moore**: There will also be opportunity for cross-comparison between other manufacturers, as Advance Transit purchased an electric Gillig, and the Marble Valley Regional Transit District (dba "The Bus") will also be purchasing an electric bus (manufacturer to be determined).

Commissioner Spencer would like to have a subgroup of Burlington commissioners to meet and manage this issue to the furthest possible degree.

Board Committee Reports (Cont. Next Page)

 Chairperson Waninger – Leadership Committee: Most May Leadership Committee work will be discussed later in today's meeting. One such item not on the agenda pertains to a service request from the town of Milton, and how the request should be viewed in light of GMT's service expansion and reinstatement policies.

Commissioner Sharrow – Operations Committee: Discussed the Transportation Asset Management Plan, as well as GMT's provision of student transportation.

Commissioner Bohne – Finance Committee: Third-Quarter financial report will be discussed later in today's meeting.

Commissioner Buermann – Strategy Committee: Took a month off after significant work in the previous month.

Commissioner Polyte – Justice, Equity, Diversity, and Inclusion (JEDI) Committee: Was absent for the June JEDI Committee meeting. Devin Mason: Committee discussed Advisory Committee recruitment strategies and opportunities. Chairperson Waninger: Has the Committee received any Advisory Committee applications? Commissioner Polyte: One application has been received *. Jamie Smith: Two individuals from the Old Spokes Home

may also be interested. **Commissioner Polyte** would like to see applicants from GMT's rural service area, to help balance representation on the Advisory Committee.

Jon Moore provided a brief update on the consultant's work plan, including surveys and upcoming trainings.



- **Board Committee Reports (Cont. from Previous Page)** 140 Commissioner Dimitruk: Could GMT advertise aboard its rural buses to recruit rural 141 Advisory Committee members. **Jamie Smith**: Planning and Marketing are currently 142 evaluating this potential. 143 144 **Chairperson Waninger**: Are we aiming for our Elderly and Disabled (federal categorization) 145 as well as fixed-route passengers? **Jamie Smith**: Yes, all passengers. 146 147 *Devin Mason was informed by a coworker/colleague that the Committee may soon receive 148 applications from two additional interested individuals, but no such applications have yet been 149 received. 150 151 **Board Officer Elections Discussion** 152 **Commissioner Kaynor**: While board officer elections occur annually, members typically 153 serve two consecutive terms, for continuity purposes. 154 155 Chairperson Waninger requested that the board extend Jon Moore's contract by two 156 months, to clear the union negotiation process. 157 158 **Commissioner Polyte** motioned that Jon Moore's contract be extended by two months. 159 **Commissioner Spencer** seconded. Motion passed unanimously. 160 161 Commissioner Cota would be glad to serve on any committees on which Former 162 Commissioner Baker served. 163 164 Commissioner Wallis: Does GMT have an August board meeting? Chairperson Waninger: 165 Yes. 166 167 **FY21 Quarter 3 Financials Review** 168 Nick Foss, Director of Finance, provided a review of GMT's third-quarter financials. 169 170 **Commissioner Wallis:** For operations expenses, how much of our net position is cost 171
 - **Chairperson Waninger**: Will local assessments fall to the Strategy Committee, or the Finance Committee? **Jon Moore**: Likely both.

- Matt Kimball provided an overview of the Transit Asset Management Plan.

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- **Commissioner Kaynor** motioned for approval of the TAM Plan. **Commissioner Bohne** seconded.
- 186 **Discussion:**
 - **Commissioner Spencer**: Is there guidance on how we should consider our capital assets each year, prior to approving the annual capital budget? **Matt Kimball**: Not specifically, but given that the study period for the plan has been extended by one year, this is one potential and intended component.

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TAM Plan approved unanimously, without further discussion.

- 195 Is there a motion to find that premature public knowledge regarding Collective
 - Bargaining negotiations would place GMT at a substantial disadvantage?
 - Commissioner Buermann motioned. Commissioner Sharrow seconded. Motion

198 passed unanimously.

- 199 Is there a motion to enter executive session pursuant to 1 VSA 313(a) (1) (b) to discuss labor 200 relations agreements with employees inviting the General Manager, Jon Moore, the Director of 201 Finance, Nick Foss, and Legal Counsel, Ed Adrian?
 - Commissioner Bohne motioned. Commissioner Spencer seconded.
- Commissioner Kaynor: Does the list of people to invite into executive session reflect Jon Moore's wishes? Jon Moore: Yes.
- Motion passed unanimously, without further discussion, and executive session began at 8:35 AM.

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No action was taken.

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Commissioner Wallis motioned to exit executive session. **Commissioner Davis** seconded. The motion passed unanimously, and the Board exited executive session at 9:51 AM.

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- 212 General Commissioner Comments
- Commissioner Buermann: With the expiration of the Governor's state of emergency, GMT may no longer hold fully-remote meetings; there must be a designated physical location where members of the public may attend public meetings in-person.

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Chairperson Waninger: Will GMT be ready to hold hybrid meetings beginning in July? **Jon Moore**: GMT is still testing the technology but anticipates being ready.

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Commissioner Cota provided a link to the Vermont League of Cities and Towns' FAQ on the lifting of the state of emergency.
